

**BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK  
REGULAR MEETING OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL  
HELD ON MAY 27, 2015**

A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the Borough of Woodland Park was held in the Council Chambers in the Municipal Building, 5 Brophy Lane, on May 27, 2015 and was called to order by Mayor Keith Kazmark at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Council President Kallert, Councilwoman Gatti, Councilman Spinelli, Kallert, Councilwoman Pascrell, Councilman DeCesare and Mayor Kazmark

Absent: Councilman Holloway

Kevin Galland, Administrator, Sandra Olivola, Deputy Municipal Clerk and Albert Buglione, Municipal Attorney, were present.

The Mayor stated in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law P.L. 1975 c.231, notice requirements for this meeting were set forth in the resolution adopted by the Municipal Council at the Reorganization Meeting of January 1, 2014 detailing the time and place, with notice given to the public by posting a copy thereof on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building and transmitting copies to the Mayor, members of the Council, Officers and to the Herald News.

**PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

Mayor Kazmark opened the meeting to the public and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

There being no one else wishing to be heard, the Public Hearing was closed.

**CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

Councilwoman Gatti reported there will be no extension for the senior tax freeze and the last day to file is June 1, 2015.

Councilman Spinelli announced that the gas and diesel tanks at the Department of Public Works will be opening within the next few weeks. He advised that a discussion was held regarding the re-painting of the water tower which has been scheduled for spring 2016.

Councilman DeCesare reported the following events being held by the Fire Department. The Tricky Tray is scheduled for September 25, 2015, Shake a Boot, sponsored by Company #2 will be held from May 29, 2015 through May 31, 2015. The personal protective gear used by the Fire Department will be arriving in two weeks. Since 2007 the Fire Department has independently raised \$263,000. Councilman DeCesare thanked Chief Paul Solomon for doing so. All adjustments are being made on the fire hydrants markers. Speed trailers were deployed throughout the Borough. Ambulance times for the month of April; 60 calls from 6:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., 14 minutes; from 6:00 P.M. to 6:00 A.M. 36 calls.

Councilwoman Kallert was happy to announce that Sister Mary from Catholic Family and Community Services visit last Wednesday reaching out and speaking to the seniors in regard to the service her organization provides. Sister Mary, in conjunction with Catholic Charities is offering door to door transportation to any Borough senior who has appointments outside the Borough limits.

Councilwoman Pascrell praise all those people who worked hard in making the Memorial Day Parade a memorable day. She thanked Kelly Spinalli and Lou Taylor on a job well done. She expressed gratitude to Shop Rite, Berkeley College and WPBA for their donations and also to everyone who attended. She commented on the success of a well attended Street Fair. Mayor Kazmark echoed his pleasure in the support everyone has shown, and the continuation of spirit throughout the Borough.

Mayor Kazmark, in Councilman Holloway absence, announced the Law & Ordinance meeting will be held on June 1, 2015. He understands the Councilman has been working on numerous planning & zoning ordinances.

**MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Kazmark began by thanking Mr. Silverstein, Mrs. Potter and Dr. Polaris for their cooperation in the preparation with Youth Month. He also thanked Kelly Spinelli and Francesco's Restaurant for helping to make this a memorable event for the children.

He stated that Mr. Galland and myself had the opportunity to attend a conference sponsored by The International Institute of the Municipal Clerk's Association. The subject matter was in regards to the Borough responsibility in responding to residents in an emergency situation. He is happy to report many of the ideas and suggestion recommended, this Borough already has adopted.

We have been awarded a Clean Community Grant in the amount of \$21,500.00. This will be applied to part time workers in the DWP and a litter patrol to keep the parks and community in the Borough clean.

He stated that he will be drafting a letter next week to the Executive Director of the Passaic Valley Water Commission relative to the reservoirs project, which appears to have taken a back seat. I am hoping they would have opened up a dialog with the City of Newark and Cedar Grove in an attempt to develop an alternative plan. I will be asking the Water Commission for an update on their last communication with the City of Newark.

And finally, item E on tonight's agenda, Mayor Kazmark stated; I will be speaking to the Municipal Engineer in regards to the modification of the Streetscape Project Improvements and we will be breaking ground sometime this year. At this point, we have roughly \$530,000.00; our original plan was to proceed to Rose Place however, with the lack of Federal funds at this time we will be starting at Glover Avenue and end at Hillary Street. We will be continuing to apply for Federal grants.

**MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY'S REPORT:**

At this time Mr. Buglione has nothing to report except for the ongoing continuous projects that are being worked on.

**RESOLUTION APPROVING INCIDENTAL MODIFICATIONS TO  
THE PROJECT SCOPE LIMITS FOR MUNICIPAL AID FY2014 &  
2015**

**WHEREAS**, the Borough of Woodland Park (Borough), County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, had originally applied for Municipal Aid FY2014 and FY2015 funding from the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) for the installation of streetscape improvements along McBride Avenue from Glover Avenue to Rose Place with an estimated construction cost of approximately \$1.4 million dollars; and

**WHEREAS**, the Borough has been allotted \$500,000.00 from the NJDOT for these improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough desires to modify the project scope limits for this Improvement Project in order to reduce costs to the amount of the grant allotment; and

**WHEREAS**, the modification will include various improvements along McBride Avenue from Glover Avenue to Hillery Street; and

**WHEREAS**, in accordance with NJDOT requirements, it is necessary to submit a limit modification request for the proposed changes to the McBride Avenue Streetscape Project;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodland Park, in the County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, do hereby authorize the Borough's Municipal Engineer to submit an Incidental Modifications to the Project Scope Limits for the McBride Avenue Streetscape Project Improvements on behalf of the Borough to the NJDOT; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Council of the Borough, does hereby authorize the Mayor, Municipal Clerk and Municipal Engineer to execute any and all necessary instruments relating thereto.

Before taking a motion to accept the consent agenda, Mayor Kazmark **pulled from the agenda item A., R15-130**. This is in regards to the Borough entering into an agreement with Allvision LLC, in reference to erecting a billboard. As everyone is aware, there has been much discussion regarding various issues throughout this process. Mayor Kazmark made a motion to open this portion of the meeting to the public for discussion on the billboard.

Upon Motion made by Councilman Spinelli, and seconded by Councilman DeCesare, the topic regarding the billboard was opened to the public for discussion.

Fire Chief Paul Salomone, West Paterson Fire Department address Mayor, Council and audience. As the Chief explained, one of his responsibility is to maintain the fire equipment; his plan to achieve and replace these vehicles was to be accomplished over an 18 year span. Chief Salomone is also not in favor of a shared service agreement, as he explained, he's has seen first handed the devastation that can be caused by not getting the equipment to a scene in a timely manner. He also stated, several years ago the Fire Department suggested a billboard placement to the Mayor with the hopes it could offset the cost of new apparatus needed for this department. Within the last 7-8 years the Fire Department has raised \$263,000 to offset costs, not to burden the tax payers, and to help with the cost to replace new fire equipment. The Chief believes adding a billboard to the community is a step in the right direction.

Upon Motion made by Councilwoman Pascrell, and seconded by Councilman Spinelli, and no one else wishing to be hear the public portion of this meeting was closed.

Mayor Kazmark thanked Chief Salomone for his thoughts and ideas and his accurate description. Allvision has provide the Borough and its residents in the proximity to the billboard location their due diligence and at this time will make a motion to vote on R15-130.

Upon Motion made by Councilman Decesare, and seconded by Councilman Spinelli, the aforgoing resolution R15-130 was unanimously adopted on roll call vote.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the ordinance entitled; AN ORDINANCE TO SUSPEND SPECIFIC PORTIONS OF SECTION 7-7.5 (PARKING TIME LIMITED ON CERTAIN STREETS) OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK THROUGH THIS SUBMISSION be and is hereby adopted as having been approved on second and final reading, and the Municipal Clerk be and he is hereby authorized and directed to publish said Ordinance according to law.
