

**BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK
REGULAR MEETING OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
HELD ON APRIL 20, 2016**

A Regular Meeting of the Municipal Council of the Borough of Woodland Park was held in the at the Four Seasons At Great Notch, 101 Four Seasons Boulevard, Woodland Park, New Jersey, on April 20, 2016 and was called to order by Mayor Keith Kazmark at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Council President Kallert, Councilman DeCesare, Councilman Holloway, Councilwoman Pascrell, Councilwoman Spinelli and Mayor Kazmark

Absent: Councilwoman Gatti

Kevin Galland, Municipal Clerk/Administrator, Sandra Olivola, Deputy Municipal Clerk and Albert Buglione, Municipal Attorney, were present.

The Mayor stated in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Law P.L. 1975 c.231, notice requirements for this meeting were set forth in the resolution adopted by the Municipal Council at the Reorganization Meeting of January 7, 2015 detailing the time and place, with notice given to the public by posting a copy thereof on the bulletin board in the Municipal Building and transmitting copies to the Mayor, members of the Council, Officers and to The Herald News.

PRESENTATIONS:

The Mayor and Council Recognized Patrolman Leonard Schaefer and Patrolman Richard Di Zenzo for a saving the life of a Woodland Park resident.

Mayor Kazmark performed the swearing in of Daniel Schaffer as a Special Class II – Police Officer for the Woodland Park Police Department.

Mayor Kazmark introduced all the Department Heads present at the meeting.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

Upon Motion by Councilman DeCesare, seconded by Council President Spinelli Mayor Kazmark opened the meeting to the public and asked if anyone wished to be heard.

Barbara Tampano of 98 Quarry Drive, Woodland Park, asked the Mayor and Council about the performance bonds with regard to the Four Seasons complex and what the process is prior to the decision to release the bonds and if there are any bonds still outstanding.

Upon Motion by Councilwoman Pascrell, seconded by Councilwoman Kallert Mayor Kazmark There being no one else wishing to be heard, the Public Hearing was closed.

Mayor Kazmark responded to Ms. Tampano and explained that every performance bond set to be released by K. Hovanian Group is reviewed by both the residents engineer and the Borough engineer. The information is reviewed by both engineers to confirm that there in concurrence with some of the concerns. Thereafter, a recommendation is made to the council. He stated that the Borough Engineer recommended to rejected the request to release the performance bonds and that rejection was confirmed in a resolution of the Mayor and Council at a meeting in March.

Mayor Kazmark turned the conversation over to the Borough Engineer, Nordan Murphy.

Mr. Murphy explained that there are currently 3 bonds in place for phases 3, 4 and 5. He further explained the review process before a recommendation is made to the council to release a bond or reject the release of the bond.

The conversation was then turned over to the Borough Administrator, Kevin Galland. Mr. Galland advised that there is one other element to the process with regard to the performance bonds. He advised that the status of a performance bond is statutorily driven by New Jersey State Law, which requires the municipality to follow. He explained when an application is made for reduction or release of an existing bond, the Borough Engineer only has 45 days to respond to the governing body and the response has to be based on the assets covered within that performance bond. They cannot go outside and discuss other assets. Once the engineer makes his recommendation the governing body then has 45 days to make a decision.

MINUTES:

Upon Motion by Councilwoman Pascrell, seconded by Councilman DeCesare, and passed on roll call vote, the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of February 3, 2016 and the Regular Meeting of February 17, 2016, were approved as submitted.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Administration & Finance – Councilman Holloway first thanked Four Seasons for the invitation and their hospitality tonight in hosting tonight’s Mayor and Council meeting. He reported that on Tuesday, April 26, 2016 he will be meeting with the web design company who may become the Borough’s new web site design company. Lastly, he advised that Ann Purzycki who will be retiring in June and is transitioning the position over to Heather Burkenbush is going smoothly.

Public Works – Councilman DeCesare reported that beginning on April 22, 2016 there will be resurfacing of certain roads throughout the town, so slow down and be careful driving. He advised that the DPW installed pressure relief valves in the Four Seasons Pump Station due to the work being done on the water tower. He also advised that the DPW will be maintaining the fields and parks during the week. Lastly, he announced there will be a softball tournament to benefit families of the police officers who are killed in the line of duty on May 21, 2016.

Public Safety – Councilman Spinelli reported that there will be police presence at the road resurfacing sites to ensure motorist safety. He advised that his committee is in the process of changing the parking pattern on Jackson Avenue to aid in the Fire Department’s current inability to set up their trucks when there is a fire. Lastly, during the month of March 2016 there were 86 ambulance calls. Paterson Fire received 9 calls during the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. with an average response time of 10.4 minutes. West Paterson First Aid Squad received 53 calls during the hours of 6:00 A.M. and 6:00 P.M. with an average response time of 5 minutes and 28 calls between the hours of 6:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. with an average response time of 6 minutes.

Health & Senior Services – Councilwoman Gatti was absent and there was nothing to report.

Recreation & Community Relations – Councilwomen Kallert announced that on Monday, May 30th please join the Mayor and Council at the Borough’s Memorial Day Parade and Street Fair. This Friday is our Arbor Day presentation where every year we plant a tree with kids from the local school. She also announced that the Library will host the following events: on Friday, they will show the film Brooklyn; on Thursday, April 28, 2016 Dr. Catalano will hold a lecture on the Role that Diet and Nutrition Have on Inflammation and Chronic Illness; on May 12, 2016; presentation Butterfly Garden presentation with Patti Pfeifer will be held on May 23, 2016; presentation Bring the Beauty of your Garden Indoors with Philip Dicristina; Bon Appetite held on every third Wednesday of the month and lastly, Friends of the Library fundraiser Literary Tea will be held on June 5, 2016.

Laws & Ordinances – Councilwoman Pascrell first thanked Four Seasons for hosting the Mayor and Council meeting. She then reported that there are three (3) new ordinances to be introduced on tonight’s agenda and she thanked the ordinance committee as well as Chief Galietti and Kevin Galland for all their hard work on getting these ordinances done.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Kazmark was happy to announce that he received a letter from the Commissioner of Transportation advising that Woodland Park has received an addition \$250,000.00 grant through the 2016 Municipal Aid Program for the purpose of continuing our streetscape project along McBride Avenue which include pavers, decorative lighting and new street signs. We have so far collected through grant money \$530,000.00 for this endeavor. We should be able to break ground on this project in late spring early summer. Phase 1 and 2 will start at Glover Avenue and continue to the Hillary Street Bridge. The addition 250,000.00 will take you up to School #1. He further stated that this project has been a long time coming and he thanked the DOT for their efforts.

He mentioned that today he had the opportunity to be at the Woodland Park Middle School to meet with our 8th grade students with regard to Youth Month which has been a long tradition since Al Bauman and his time as Mayor. He explained that our 8th graders run for election and during the month of May they participate as a member of the Mayor and Council as well as each department head positions. After elected they will have a tour of the town and have the opportunity to partake in a Mayor and Council meeting, Board of Education meeting and a Municipal Court session as well as partake in the Memorial Day Parade and we conclude with a Youth Month Dinner where the students involved are recognized and presented with awards.

He advised that tomorrow there will be an article in the Today newspaper which details the tremendous improvements to the communications center in the Police Department. He further advised that rather than having to bond for this project and incur debt and have the ability to update the equipment every 15 to 20 years, we will be leasing the equipment for 5 years through Goosetown Communications and we will renew that lease after the 5 years and a total upgrade is complete. The Police Department is now able to view via security cameras each of our schools, the Library and the outside of Municipal Building. By midsummer all the parks will have security cameras and tied into the police desk as well.

He mentioned the Refunding Bond Ordinance that we set up with our financial advisors and there is a substantial savings. He turned the conversation over to Borough Administrator Kevin Galland.

Mr. Galland gave a brief explanation as to what a refunding bond is and how it works and used the example of it being like refinancing a mortgage. He advised that in 2009 the Borough contracted \$7,000,000.00 at a 4% interest rate. He said today because our Financial Advisor's remained active on this they basically sold the \$7,000,000.00 which was bought at a 2% interest rate. As a result of this transaction, over the life of this bond, the municipality was saved \$375,000.00.

Mayor Kazmark stated that he has been working with Senator O'Toole, who represents our district, on trying to compel Verizon Fios to complete the install for phases 1 and 2 here at the Four Seasons Complex. Senator O'toole has been very helpful in communicating the need at Four Seasons to Verizon Fios. He explained that what Verizon is looking for is if there is a customer base here at the complex. He advised that when he met with representatives of the homeowners associations he had asked them to put out a survey to the folks in phases 1 and 2 in order to bring the results back to Verizon Fios to show that there is a customer base. Mr. O'toole's office has advised that this survey information has been conveyed to Verizon. Unfortunately, Verizon is currently dealing with a strike and the Mayor was unable to get an updated however, when things do calm down and go back to normal he will be back on track to try and get the ball moving forward on this issue.

Lastly, he stated that another interesting topic that was brought up by the representatives of the homeowners association, was the standby fee for water and how it is taxing to your budget here within the Four Seasons community. We did a comparison of our water standby fee in comparison with Passaic Valley Water Commission and New Jersey American Water. He stated that while we are comparable with our standby fee, the one

thing he can say in reading this ordinance is it is my understanding is that the standby fee was set up for commercial businesses. He stated that he doesn't believe that the person who wrote this ordinance 20 maybe 50 years ago believed it would affect a residential building. Through the efforts of Bernadette Lawler the Tax Collector/Water Collector and looked at the different residential buildings in which this standby fee must be paid. It includes the number of buildings here at Four Seasons and one other residential building in town which is 375 Rifle Camp Road, the over 55 building, Tower Ridge Apartments. He further stated that he has asked the ordinance committee to review this ordinance and see if we can modify how this standby fee is applied to residential homes/buildings. He advised they will get back to the leadership of the homeowners association with our final decision on this.

Finally, he advised that he has been in constant contact with Debra **Hurt** who is the Government Regulations representative for the New Jersey Department of Transportation relative to the work that is ongoing on the improvements being made to Route 46. He stated that they have tried to have them minimize the evening work. He believes it will begin to transition to more daytime work. He did encourage the residents that if they are being disturbed during the overnight hours to contact his office and document it with Tom Minnella so that we can communicate this to the DOT.

MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY'S REPORT:

Mr. Buglione reported that his office is continuing with all of the outstanding obligations. He advised that they are currently drafting additional ordinances. He stated he does have one comment with regard to the performance bonds he would like the audience to know that on multiple occasions the Borough professional have been accused of providing the homeowners association with preferential treatment by the developers representatives and would like them to know that we have been in constant communication with the developers representatives and we have informed them that unless they comply with the recommendations of our professionals, Code Enforcement, the DPW Superintendent and our Engineer we are not going to release any of the performance bond or give them any approval. When they threaten litigation, we ask them for documentation on how we are giving them preferential treatment, as opposed to our request that the work be done properly and on the six (6) occasions that we have done that, they have not replied. We are confident in the stand that we have taken to protect the residents as well as the Borough to make sure that the infrastructure is proper.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE APPROVAL OF A DISABLED VETERAN TAX EXEMPTION AND TAX CREDIT TO ROGER NICK FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 37 LINCOLN LANE IN BLOCK 110.01 ON LOT 12

WHEREAS, Roger Nick and Theresa Napoli are the owners of the property located at 37 Lincoln Lane in Block 110.01 on Lot 12 as set forth on the official tax map of the Borough of Woodland Park, and who had filed an application for a Disabled Veteran Tax Exemption which was approved by the Tax Assessor on April 4, 2016.

WHEREAS, Mr. Nick was deemed to be 100% permanently and totally disabled as the result of his wartime injuries by letter from the VA on November 10, 2015, effective as of November 7, 2014, and took title to the property through a life estate with his spouse Theresa Napoli on February 26, 2016 so by statute he is entitled to the tax exemption as of February 26, 2016; and

WHEREAS, since the Tax Assessor has approved the tax exemption as of February 26, 2016 and the owners have paid their 2016 1st quarter tax payment, as per the calculations of the Tax Collector they are due a total refund of \$1,103.66; and

WHEREAS, the governing body must authorize the Tax Collector to refund taxes in the amount of \$1,103.66 which is the total amount of the overpayment; and

WHEREAS, the governing body will also have to authorize the Tax Collector to cancel the 2016 2nd quarter tax payment in the amount of \$2,869.89 due to the fact the property is now tax exempt.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Woodland Park in the County of Passaic and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The owners shall be given a tax refund in the amount of \$1,103.66 as the property was made tax exempt effective as of February 26, 2016.

2. The Borough Tax Collector is hereby authorized to issue the refund in the amount of \$1,103.66 and is also authorized to cancel the 2016 2nd quarter tax payment in the amount of \$2,869.89.

3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately or as otherwise provided by law.

C. Resolution R16-136, Introduction of Ordinance 16-09

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SEC. 6-4 ENTITLED “REGULATION OF LICENSES” OF CHAPTER VI ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE CONTROL OF THE GENERAL CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF THE WOODLAND PARK, heretofore introduced, does now pass on first reading, and that said ordinance be further considered for final passage at a meeting to be held on the 11th day of May, 2016, at 7:00 P.M., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be reached, at the regular meeting place of the Municipal Council and that at such time and place all persons interested be given an opportunity to be heard concerning said ordinance, and that the Municipal Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish said ordinance according to law with a notice of its introduction and passage on first reading and of the time and place when and where said ordinance will be further considered for final passage.

D. Resolution R16-142, a resolution authorizing the issuance of General Improvement Refunding Bonds, Dated May 5, 2016, authorized pursuant to the refunding ordinance (16-05) adopted by the Mayor and Council of the Borough on March 16, 2016. Said Bonds are being issued to refund \$7,020,000 aggregate principal amount of the Borough’s outstanding General Improvement Bonds dated July 15, 2009, with an anticipated savings of some \$375,000.00.

There being no further business to come before the Council, upon Motion by Councilman , seconded by Councilman and unanimously passed on roll call vote, the meeting was adjourned at 8:40 p.m.
