**ORDINANCE No. 09-05**

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XI OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK, WHICH IS ALSO KNOWN AS THE “TRAFFIC ORDINANCE” TO REMOVE A STOP SIGN ON THE NORTH BOUND ONE-WAY SPUR OF MOUNT PLEASANT AVENUE AT THE INTERSECTION WITH MOUNT PLEASANT AVENUE AND INSTALL A YIELD SIGN AT THAT INTERSECTION**

**WHEREAS**, Chapter XI, Section 7-11 of the Ordinances of the Borough of Woodland Park which is known as “Traffic Ordinances” names traffic stop intersections; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodland Park seeks to remove the stop sign on the north bound one-way spur of Mount Pleasant Avenue at the intersection with Mount Pleasant Avenue and to install a Yield sign at the companion entering road section, from Browertown Road, at this intersection;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodland Park, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, as follows:

**I.** Chapter XI, Section 7-11 of the Ordinances of the Borough of Woodland Park, shall be and are hereby amended as follows:

“The Stop sign that is currently on the north bound one-way spur of Mount Pleasant Avenue at the intersection of Mount Pleasant Avenue is to hereby be removed, and a Yield sign is to be installed at the intersection of the roadway connecting Browertown Road with Mount Pleasant Avenue”.

**II.** All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**III.** If any section, paragraph, subdivision or provision of this subsection shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the paragraph, subdivision clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the subsection shall be deemed valid and effective.

**IV.** This Ordinance is held to be vital to the public health, safety and welfare of the Borough of Woodland Park, and shall take effect immediately upon the passage and publication provided by law.
