**Public Hearing on Resolutions 10-150 and 10-158**

**A. Resolution R10-150 a resolution setting the General Fund Tax Levy for the Passaic Valley High School 2010-2011 school year at \$20,204,210.00 which reflects a reduction of \$80,000.00 in the General Fund Budget.**

**WHEREAS**, on April 20, 2010, the 2010-2011 Budget of the Passaic Valley Regional High School District #1 was defeated in the school election; and

**WHEREAS**, the administration and representatives of the Board and representatives of the three governing bodies consisting of the Borough of Woodland Park, the Borough of Totowa and the Township of Little Falls met to resolve the amount of the 2010-2011 Budget reduction;

**THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AND AGREED** that the General Fund Tax Levy should be set for the 2010-2011 School Year at \$20,204,210.00, which reflects a reduction of \$80,000.00 in the General Fund Budget.
