In addition, parking will also be allowed: from a point 195 feet from the intersection of McBride Avenue and Memorial Drive, to a point 826 feet, where two legally marked 20 foot parking spaces are added (totaling 40 feet), then continuing from a point 866 feet (from the original point 195 feet from the intersection at Memorial), extending “No Parking” for an additional 20 feet (due to a fire hydrant in the middle of the 20 feet) to another point 886 feet (from the original point 195 feet from the intersection at Memorial), then extending to a point 926 feet after where two legally marked 20 foot parking spaces (totaling 40 feet) are added, extending to a point 1062 feet (from the intersection of Memorial and McBride), where two legally marked 20 foot parking spaces are added (totaling 40 feet) are added, to a point 1102 feet (from the intersection of McBride Avenue and Dowling Parkway), then extending to include a 15 foot marked out (“No Parking”) buffer, to a point 1117 feet north, (from the intersection), where tow legally marked 20 foot parking spaces are added (totaling 40 feet), to another point 1157 feet (from the original pint 195 feet from the intersection at Memorial), and ending at the intersection of McBride Avenue and Dowling Parkway.”

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 7 OF THE CODE OF THE
BOROUGH OF WOODLAND PARK, WITH REGARD TO STOP
INTERSECTIONS AND YIELD INTERSECTIONS
(removal of a yield sign and installation of a stop sign)**

SECTION 1

Through this amendment to existing ordinances, please note that the Borough of Woodland Park hereby amends, revises and supplements, previously enacted ordinances by Borough §7-1, et. seq, with regard to traffic enforcement and controls. Particular attention should be paid to the subparts of chapters: §7-11 Stop Intersections and 7-12 Yield Intersections. Wherein, through this amendment, the Yield Sign currently existing at the intersection of Mt. Pleasant Avenue and Mt. Pleasant Avenue extension (at the merge) will be converted a Stop Sign.

C. PURPOSE

The purpose for this amendment to these existing ordinances is for the continued protection of the health, welfare and safety of the citizens of Woodland Park, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey. Through the advice and recommendation of the Woodland Park Police Department, these amendments are hereby approved by the Honorable Mayor and Council of the Borough of Woodland Park – which will accommodate the need to provide further traffic safety.

B. DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this ordinance, all of the terms, phrases, words and their derivations which have been already stated in the original ordinance, generally notated as chapter §7-1, et. seq, will remain in full force and effect, and apply to the within amendments to Borough’s ordinances.

C. AMENDMENT TO ORDINANCE §7-11 STOP INTERSECTIONS and §7-12 YIELD INTERSECTIONS

Through the amendment to this ordinance, please note that the Borough hereby amends previously adopted ordinances to provide the following: **The current yield sign located at the intersection of Mt. Pleasant Avenue and Mt. Pleasant Avenue Extension (at the merge), will no longer be a yield sign – instead, the said intersection will now be governed by a stop sign.**

D. ENFORCEMENT, VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES

Please note that all of the applicable directives for enforcement, violations and penalties that have been established in the prime ordinance, noted as chapter §7-1, et. seq, of the Borough’s ordinance will remain in full force and effect for the amendments prescribed herein.

SECTION II

All other provisions of this Chapter shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

SECTION III

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions of the within Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency only.

SECTION IV

If any article, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason deemed to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION V

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.
