### CURBSIDE PICK UP FOR SOLID WASTE

Tuesday & Friday

Place solid waste/garbage curbside after 3:00 PM the day **BEFORE** scheduled pick up or **NO later** than 5:00 AM on the day of collection!

Construction debris is **NOT** permitted in solid waste/garbage collection. These items must be removed by the contractor or homeowner.

Please follow proper curbside placement hours in order to reduce wind-blown garbage, animals getting into curbside garbage & to keep our borough looking clean!



**CHRISTMAS TREES** – will be recycled and collected by the DPW throughout the month of January. Please remove all ornaments, garland, lights

**TREE CANNOT BE IN A PLASTIC BAG.**

### RECYCLING CENTER

Computers, electronics, appliances and metal **will not** be picked up with your garbage. They must be brought to the recycling center and placed in appropriate containers or call the DPW Office at 973-256-1264 arrange for a curbside pick-up on bulky items.

#### ITEMS ACCEPTED:

- Air Conditioners - \$5.00 Fee for containing Freon
- Appliances and Scrap Metal – All metal items
- Cardboard and Newspaper – **NO PIZZA BOXES**
- Commingled – **NO PLASTIC BAGS**
- Grass and Brush – **NO PLASTIC BAGS**



#### Electronics - TVs, computer monitors, printers/faxes

- **Refrigerators** - \$5.00 Fee for containing Freon
- Tires – free of rims - \$2.50 fee - Proof of residency required.
- **Vehicle Batteries** – No charge
- **Motor Oil** – Limit one (1) gallon and not contaminated with other fluids. Proof of residency required.

#### ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED:

- Propane Tanks
- Solid Waste / Garbage
- Construction Debris
- Tree Stumps / Logs / Railroad Ties / Pallets / Concrete

### COMMINGLED CURBSIDE PICK-UP

Place commingles in an appropriately marked 35-gallon container. Decals are available at the Recycling Center or DPW Office.

**DO NOT place commingled material in plastic bags.**

**Commingled items Include:** Glass Containers, Plastics #1 and #2, Aluminum containers, Tin cans

#### **Does Not Include:**

- Aluminum foil & food containers
- Bubble Wrap & Styrofoam
- Containers from any oil product
- Dishes, drinking glasses & cups
- Flowerpots, Garden Hoses
- Hazardous Waste
- Light Bulbs
- Mirrors & Window glass
- Plate glass
- Pyrex & cookware
- Rubbermaid or buckets
- Toys



### CARDBOARD & NEWSPAPER CURBSIDE PICK-UP

CARDBOARD should be broken down and left curbside. NEWSPAPERS are to be in cardboard box, paper bag or recycling bin. **DO NOT place cardboard & newspapers in plastic bags.**

#### **Cardboard & Newspaper Items Include:**

- Corrugated Cardboard
- Magazines
- Office Paper
- Paper Bags
- Junk Mail
- Newspapers
- Paperback Books



#### **Does Not Include:**

Cardboard boxes that contain grease, cheese, crusts or wax paper liners are highly detrimental to the recycling process. So please, recycle only empty and clean boxes including pizza boxes.

If you want to, you can rip off and dispose of the soiled part and recycle the rest.

### **DO NOT bag recyclables!**

A reminder to residents that recycling should not be put out in plastic bags, as it will not be collected by the hauler.

Residents should place commingled recycling out in any kind of plastic or metal can from 36 to 64 gallons.

Residents should not use 5-gallon buckets, milk crates or small used plastic containers.

### **RECYCLE TIPS**

Bottles/cans should be empty and rinsed clean



Usually clear and used to make soda and water bottles



Usually opaque found in milk jugs, cleaner containers, shampoo bottles and used to make pens, lumber, fencing and detergent bottle.
